Dear Natural Resources Wales,

Please find enclosed two documents that relate to the Heol y Glyn landfill site in Glynneath earmarked for a housing development. The documents identify 'cause and effect' for deaths that relate to contamination at the site.

Your organisations refusal to answer my emails in relation to my reports of contamination at the site and subsequent information requests I suspect have been fuelled by the corrupt actions of the Neath Port Talbot Council and their identification of me as a vexatious complainant. It should be noted that they are covering up a breach of the 1990 Environmental Protection Act and have used methods of deception and blocking to avoid my relevant queries in relation to this. It has been their goal to identify me as vexatious so that I am not taken seriously by related organisations such as yourselves.

The document that relates to the PSP deaths should give you some idea as to the seriousness of the contamination at the Heol y Glyn site. I have reported these deaths as unlawful killing to South Wales Police (2100132983) , there may be several more, the site has been used mainly as landfill since 1940, predominantly as an ash tip and latterly as industrial landfill. I would hope you will take the time to investigate the information contained in the documents supplied and ensure the land bordering our properties is made safe.
